



From the CEO

The River Murray flooding finally peaked at Mildura and Wentworth mid to late December 2022.

WMI commenced preparing and maintaining infrastructure and assets with forecast high river flows in August.

Significant works to strengthen and maintain the 19km Curlwaa levee began in October and urgent repairs to a levee breach over the 19-20 November weekend were successful.

Wentworth Shire Council cut through Old Wentworth Road to alleviate the build-up of pressure on the Curlwaa levee from Tuckers Creek. Water was then directed naturally to Fletchers Lake.

It's been a very long time since Fletchers Lake was full.

I would like to thank our team and contractors who were quickly on site working to repair the breach in quite hazardous conditions; Wentworth Shire Council for cutting through Old Wentworth Road to alleviate the water pressure from Tucker's Creek overflow; and to the Curlwaa residents who assisted and those that continue to assist WMI monitor the levee for any problems.

A prolonged peak is expected at Wentworth through to early January 2023 putting additional risk to the integrity of the levee. Repairs and reinforcement options are continually being assessed by WMI.

Widespread flooding has reduced water quality through a blackwater event. Warmer weather has also increased the risk of blue-green algae blooms. These conditions are likely to continue for some time causing filtration and other problems for customers. WMI will update our website with the latest alerts and use SMS when the alerts change.

Do you have excess Delivery Entitlements and/or outlets that are oversized or no longer used?

Customers considering terminating their excess Delivery Entitlements have only until <u>31 January</u> <u>2023</u> to access the 80% discount offer.

- Allison McTaggart as Deputy Chair.


The Board also approved an increase to the number of Delivery Entitlements a NSW High Security Water Entitlement customer can hold before requiring security, effective immediately.

For High Security Water Entitlement (WE) customers, the ratio is now up to 8 Delivery Entitlements (DEs) for every 1 High Security WE. For General Security customers, the ratio remains at 5 DEs for every 1 General Security WE.

Second Quarterly Invoice Due for Payment

The second quarter invoice for 2022/23 is now available and due for payment on or before Monday 06 February 2023.

To have your quarterly invoices paid by direct debit from a nominated bank account, contact the office for a form and your invoice will always be paid on time.

Additional Water Fee Reminder

Water usage above allocation is billed quarterly at \$1,200/ML (or part thereof).

Please ensure you **always have a positive water allocation balance**. Customers should contact the friendly office staff for more information.

Water Ordering & Accuracy is Important

To ensure WMI's supply system works effectively, accurate water orders must be placed by irrigation customers (with meters 80mm and above).

It is important that a water order is placed correctly before commencing irrigation and that the flow rate and duration is adhered to. Over ordering can cause other irrigators' orders to be rejected, under ordering can overload the system causing a loss of water pressure or, in the case of Buronga, cause the pump station to shut down due to a leakage warning.

If a meter isn't recording correctly an estimate of water use will be used for billing purposes. Estimates are based on water ordered and/or historical use.

Please continue to keep outlets clean

The recent wet and warmer weather has seen an abundance of plant growth including weeds and the emergence of snakes.

Customers are reminded to keep outlets free of weeds, equipment, and rubbish, ensuring easy and safe access for our operations staff.

Prosecution begins over unlawful water take at Lower Murray vineyard

The NSW Natural Resources Access Regulator (NRAR) has begun a significant prosecution in the NSW Land and Environment Court against a Lower Murray vineyard operator.

NRAR will allege that the former owner of a vineyard near Wentworth by-passed water meters and pumped up to 13,000 ML of water beyond their licence allocation.


The water was allegedly taken from the Darling River over four years between 2011 and 2015.

Quarterly reporting data gathered during July to September 2022 has also highlighted that illegal water take and water meter breaches remain the most common offence in NSW.
