- If Delivery Entitlement Units are held, or to be held, jointly by two or more persons, each person must be named as a party and each person must sign this application. The parties' details must be identical to the details on their respective Agreements with WMI.
- 2 Permanent Transfers require the approval of the Board.<sup>1</sup>
- The transaction is subject to the Seller paying to WMI all outstanding debts and other amounts payable.<sup>2</sup>
- Delivery Entitlement Units cannot be transferred outside the irrigation district of the Landholding to which they relate.<sup>3</sup>
- The transaction will take effect upon its entry into the Registers by WMI or such other date as WMI may specify.<sup>4</sup>
